



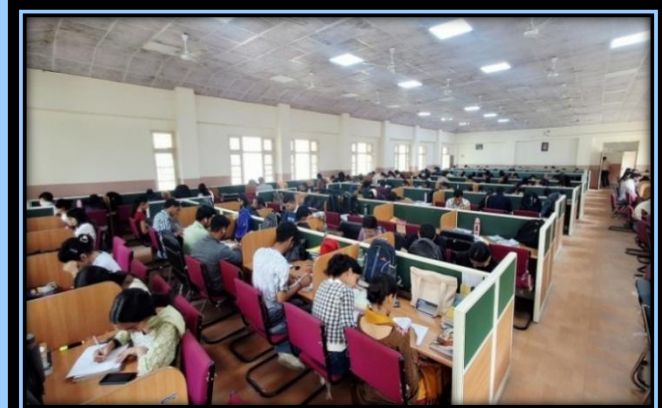

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

The college is named after the country's prominent freedom fighter, great administrator and the recipient of the Bharat Ratna Sh. Govind Ballabh Pant, and is duly affiliated to Himachal Pradesh University (Shimla). This college came into existence in July, 1959 but was formally inaugurated on 11th November, 1959 by Raja Bajrang Bahadur Singh of Bhadri estate, the then lieutenant Governor of Himachal Pradesh. Situated on the left bank of the river Satluj, the college is on the national highway no. 5 and at a distance of about 130 km from the historical town of Shimla, the capital city of Himachal Pradesh.

The college is a co-educational institution and imparts meaningful education in the faculties of Humanities, Science, Commerce, Vocation, and Computer Applications. After its inception in 1959 for undergraduate programmes, the year 1994 marked its new phase of academic development with the opening of Postgraduate classes in the subject of Hindi, English, Commerce, History, Economics, and Political Science. In the year 2017, the new PG courses in the subject of Sociology, Geography, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physics and Mathematics were introduced. The self- finance course of Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) was started in the academic session 2010-11, based on the feedback of the stakeholders. The skill-oriented Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) was added to the programmes of the college in the year 2017. The primary objective for the implementation of these courses is to empower the youth with practical knowledge that will lead to quality employment and income generating opportunities.

The college campus has a green cover of trees, a sprawling playground and a well-equipped auditorium that provide a healthy ambience for the holistic growth of the students beyond their classrooms. It is surrounded by the scenic beauty of hills that provides the students with ample green space to learn and interact in a lively fresh environment. CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK FOR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES

1 Introduction

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 recognises that higher education plays a crucial role in promoting human and societal well-being, and in developing India as envisioned in its Constitution—a democratic, just, socially conscious, and humane nation that upholds liberty, equality, fraternity, and justice for all. The NEP 2020 notes, "given the 21st-century requirements, quality higher education must aim to develop good, thoughtful, well-rounded, and creative individuals."

The NEP 2020 states, "*Assessments of educational approaches in undergraduate education that integrate the humanities and arts with Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) have consistently shown positive learning outcomes, including increased creativity and innovation, crucial thinking and higher-order thinking capacities, problem-solving abilities, teamwork, communication skills, more in-depth learning and mastery of curricula across fields, increases in social and moral awareness, etc., besides general engagement and enjoyment of learning.*"

Further, the NEP 2020 also recommends that "*the undergraduate degree will be of either 3- or 4-year duration, with multiple exit options within this period, with appropriate certifications.*"

In accordance with the NEP 2020, the UGC has formulated a new student-centric "**Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (UGC-CCFUGP 2022)**" incorporating a flexible choice-based credit system, multidisciplinary approach, and multiple entry and exit options, which will facilitate students to pursue their career path by choosing the subject/field of their interest.

Based on the UGC-CCFUGP notified in December 2022, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla (HPU) has developed a Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (HPU-CCFUGP, hereafter HPU-UGP), incorporating all essential aspects of the UGC-CCFUGP to facilitate the achievement of the policy visions stated in the NEP 2020. This HPU-UGP will also apply to the professional courses not covered by other regulatory bodies.

1.1 New Curriculum and Credit Framework

The aims and objectives of the Curriculum and Credit Framework under NEP 2020 are to highlight certain fundamental principles that will guide both the education system as a whole and individual educational institution. These objectives, as stated below, have a direct bearing on the curricula for different levels of higher education:

- i. First of all, the policy endeavours to recognise, identify, and foster the unique capabilities of

- each student to promote their holistic development.
- ii. It also attempts to provide flexibility, allowing learners to select their learning trajectories and programmes, and thereby choose their path in life according to their talents and interests.
 - iii. The policy promises to provide multidisciplinary and holistic education across the sciences, social sciences, arts, humanities, and sports for an interdisciplinary world.
 - iv. It emphasises conceptual understanding rather than rote learning. The policy also aims to foster critical thinking and encourages learners to make logical decisions.
 - v. The policy upholds ethics, and human & constitutional values and emphasises building life skills such as communication, teamwork, leadership, and resilience.
 - vi. The policy also emphasises the extensive use of technology in teaching and learning, removing language barriers, increasing access for students with disabilities (*Divyang*), and enhancing educational planning and management.
 - vii. The policy aims to ensure respect for diversity and the local context in all curricula, pedagogy, and policies.
 - viii. The policy emphasises equity and inclusion as the cornerstone of all educational decisions, ensuring that all students can thrive in the education system. It also ensures that the institutional environment is responsive to differences, thereby making high-quality education available to all.
 - ix. The policy also aims to ensure that the education system is grounded in the values of Indian civilisation and fosters pride in India and its rich, diverse, ancient, and modern culture, languages, knowledge systems, and traditions.

The National Education Policy 2020 marks a new era in the Indian education system, focusing on flexibility, inclusivity and the holistic development of students. NEP 2020 aims to prepare a generation of learners who are not only academically proficient but also equipped with the critical skills needed to thrive in the 21st century.

2. UG Degree Programmes

At the initial stage of implementation of NEP2020, students shall have the following Degree Options:

A. The 3-year UG Programmes shall have two degree options:

- i. Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary
- ii. Single Core Discipline (Major)
 - The students shall declare their Major and Minor, finally, at the end of the second semester.
 - In both cases, the requirement of core and common courses remains the same.

B. The Four-year UG Programme shall have two degree options:

i. Honours

ii. Honours with Research

- Students with 3-year Degrees in the Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary programme will have to choose, in the fourth year, only one of the disciplines in which they have studied six DSCs and five DSEs in the first three years.
- Students with a 3-year undergraduate degree in a Single Core Discipline (Major) will pursue a fourth year in their Major discipline.

3. Programme Components

Towards the attainment of holistic and multidisciplinary education, the HEI/College will offer courses from every Department before the commencement of each semester, listing the courses for Major, Minors, Discipline-Specific Electives, Multidisciplinary Studies, Ability Enhancement, Skill Enhancement, and Value Addition, along with the offering departments and course in-charges. This will enable students to select the courses of their choice. The students will then choose the courses of their choice from the list being offered, taking into account the requirements outlined in the curriculum of the degree they are pursuing.

The entire 3-year/4-year UG programme curriculum is divided into two parts: (a) Core Courses and (b) Common Courses, which are described below.

A. List of Core Courses

The core courses comprise Discipline-Specific, Discipline-Specific Elective (DSE), and Minor courses. All core courses have a credit allocation of 4. Altogether, irrespective of any significant or minor options, a student will necessarily need to study 23 courses with a total credit allocation of 92 over a 3-year programme. The degrees relevant to the core courses will be awarded.

i. Major Courses

Courses offered by a particular department for own students. The minimum credit requirement for a Single Core Discipline (Major) over 3 years is 64, which translates to 16 courses, including 5 DSEs.

ii. Minor Courses

One of the Major courses offered by the Department shall be treated as a Minor for students of other departments. The department may also offer a separate course or repeat the same course(s) as a Minor for students of other departments. The minimum credit requirement for a Minor Course over 3 years is 24, which translates to 6 courses.

B. List of Common Courses

As the name suggests, these courses must be studied by all students in the 3-year or 4- year undergraduate programme. Together, the common courses have a credit allocation of 36, divided over five subdivisions.

i. Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC): Total Credits 9

Courses offered by a particular department shall be considered multidisciplinary for students of other departments. A student cannot opt for an MDC catering to their Core Courses (Major and Minor).The student should be motivated to opt for a different subject each semester.

ii. Ability Enhancement Course(AEC): Total Credits 8

Courses on Language and Communication Skills, viz .English, Hindi, and Sanskrit

iii. Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): Total Credits 9

The HEI/College will identify the Skill Enhancement Courses to be offered in a semester, and students will choose the skill course of his/her choice from the courses offered.

iv. I/A/P/C/(or Work-based Vocational Course*): Total credits 4

Internship/ Apprenticeship/ Minor Project/ Community Outreach(I/A/P/C) or Work-based Vocational Courses are courses common to all students and will be carried out during the winter and summer terms/vacations. Although offered in the second semester, students may be encouraged to make their choice at the end of the first semester, allowing them to carry out activities during winter vacation as well.

*This course will not be offered in the first (beginning) academic session.

v. Value-Addition Course (VAC): Total 6 Credits

These are the course(s) common to all students to be offered as a VAC category in a particular semester. The HEI/College will assign one or more teachers to teach these courses as required, regardless of the teacher's background or qualifications.

4. Eligibility for the UG Programmes

- a. A student who has passed 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from a recognised institution (UGC-CCFUGP: 3.2.3).
- b. Admission to the 3-year/4-year UG programme will be based on the preference of the Major, if any. In case a student does not want to opt for any major in the 3-year programmes/they will be admitted based on their preferences for subject combinations.
- c. Admission to a discipline-specific course or major will be subject to the availability of the

subject and the capacity of the college/department/centre.

- d. No students shall be eligible for admission to a programme in any discipline unless s/he fulfils the prerequisites of courses as fixed by the university.

5. Reservation

The statutory reservation policy of the Government of Himachal Pradesh shall be followed in the selection of eligible candidates for admission.

6. Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)

The HPU-UGP is directly connected to the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) as notified by the UGC. All credits a student earns at the end of an examination in HPU-UGP will be deposited in the ABC by the university.

As such, **a student under HPU-UGP must register for the ABC** as notified by the regulatory agencies.

7. Duration for Award of UG Certificate, UG Diploma and Degree

The UG Programmes will be of either 3 or 4-year duration with appropriate certifications and exits, such as:

- i. UG Certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study with **44 credits**, including four credits in I/A/P/C/ or work-based vocational course(s) offered during winter/or summer term.
- ii. UG Diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study with **86 credits**.
- iii. 3-Year Bachelor's Degree after successful completion of three years (6 semesters) with 128 credits.
- iv. 4-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours) after successful completion of four years (eight semesters) with **168 credits**.
- v. 4-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research) after successful completion of four years (eight semesters) with a Research Project or Dissertation under the guidance of an eligible regular faculty member, securing **168 credits**, out of which **12 credits** will be for the Research Project or Dissertation.
- vi. Students will be permitted to take a break from the study during the period of study, but the total duration of completing the programme shall not exceed 7 years.

It should be noted that any certificate/diploma/degree is awarded only if the student clears (i.e., passes) all the required courses (papers) up to that point in time.

8. Change of Programme

The students who wish to change programmes in the 2nd year (or third semester) shall be eligible only for the 3-year B.A. programme (Multidisciplinary), subject to availability of seats and the Major programme in the College and earning of additional credits (8 each in each of the two core Major disciplines). Two courses of any one discipline studied in the first two semesters will be treated as a Minor. The remaining 16 credits shall be earned from a single Minor discipline.

9. Multiple Exits and Entries

As permissible under UGC Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in Higher Education Institutions, students will be allowed to enter/re-enter in the odd semesters and exit after even semesters, provided that they fulfil the minimum requirements for entry and exit.

For example, a student can exit a programme after one year and then re-enter the programme at a later time, continuing from where they left off. This process can be executed multiple times. However, entry into the programme is subject to the availability of positions at the institute/college at that time. However, an institution can increase the number of seats by ten percent to accommodate students re-entering the programme or coming from a different institution. Besides, the following should apply:

- a. A student will receive a certificate/diploma/degree upon exiting the HPU-UGP (depending on the year of graduation), provided they have passed all the minimum compulsory courses at that point in time.
- b. After exiting, either at the end of Year 1 or Year 2, the student can seek entry only into the same program to which they were initially admitted.
- c. When a student exits the HPU-UGP after 3 years with a Bachelor's Degree, s/he cannot seek re-entry into the programme in the fourth year; instead/they will need to take admission into the Master's programme in the first year.
- d. Students with a UG degree with Honours after 4 years will have to take admission into the second year of a 2-year Master's programme.
- e. Students with a UG degree with Honours and Research after 4 years can directly progress to a PhD programme, provided they secure a minimum of 75% marks.
- f. As the contents (syllabi) of all courses are subject to modification from time to time, when a student re-enters the programme after an earlier exit, they must study the content of all courses available at that time.

The Multiple Entry and Exit policy shall also include students from other Universities and Colleges affiliated with other Universities who wish to join H.P. University or its affiliated colleges. The admission of such students shall be based on the merit of their score in the previous Semesters and availability of seats.

10. Semester-wise Programme Components

UGC has prepared a model for the semester-wise distribution of different categories of courses. Based on this model, the UG Programme Structure is framed, and the semester-wise course and credit distribution of UG Programmes are presented in the Tables (28) below.

Semesters 1 & 2: Students will choose 3 discipline-specific (one stream) core courses (A, B, and C). Students opting for a Single Core Discipline (Major) have to select a Major and Minor out of the 3 subjects studied in the 1st and 2nd semesters at the end of the 2nd semester. Another discipline's DSC/course studied in the first two semesters will be treated as a minor. Additionally, these students will also take courses of their interest from **Multidisciplinary, Ability Enhancement, Skill Enhancement, and Value-Addition categories**. Students will also be placed in an internship/apprenticeship/field project, or community engagement and service program, as well as participate in field-based learning / minor projects.

Semesters 3 & 4: Students will select courses of interest in their major and minor to build a career of interest. Students opting for the stream-based Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary UG programme will have to declare one of the three subjects as a Minor in the 3rd semester. The other 02 subjects will remain their Core (Major) subjects. **All students will study the DSE of core courses, excluding the Minor. Students studying a Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary 3-year degree are strongly advised to choose one subject for all the DSEs in which they wish to do Honours or Honours with Research in 4th Year, as they must study at least 5 DSEs of that discipline in the 2nd and 3rd years.** They will also pursue courses from multidisciplinary, ability enhancement, skill enhancement, and value-addition categories.

Semesters 5 & 6: Students will undertake higher-level courses and related courses during the 5th & 6th semesters to gain in-depth knowledge in the core courses, including DSEs (2 each) in the 5th & 6th semesters, along with an ability enhancement course.

Semesters 7 & 8: During the fourth and final year, students will undertake advanced-level courses to earn a 4-year undergraduate degree. Students opting for a Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research) will undertake a Research Project or Dissertation. Students may be permitted to conduct a research project or dissertation in another department of the same institution or at another institution, provided the required facilities are available.

The 7th-semester courses for students pursuing a Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research) will focus on research methodology and advanced courses in both theoretical and applied areas.

As part of the research methodology, students are also expected to undertake preparatory activities, such as writing research proposals, conducting laboratory experiments, collecting

data, or engaging in fieldwork, for their research project or dissertation. The 8th semester will be devoted to report writing and the presentation of Research Projects/Dissertations, along with major courses that may be seminar-based, featuring presentations and discussions.

For students opting for a Bachelor's Degree (Honours), the 7th & 8th-semester courses for both major and minor will be advanced-level courses in theory and applied areas, as well as seminar presentations. Honours students not undertaking research will take five advanced-level courses in the 8th semester.

11. Entry and Exit Options

As permissible under UGC Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in Higher Education Institutions, students will be allowed to enter/re-enter in the odd semesters and after even semesters, provided that they fulfil the minimum requirements for entry and exit.

12. Attendance

A student shall be **eligible to appear in the end-semester examination only if he/she has a minimum of 75% attendance.** The terms and rules governing condoning can be found in the Examination Section of the Ordinance.

13. Examination & Grading

The examination and grading modalities of HPU-UGP will be in accordance with HPU's Examination and Grading Ordinance/Notifications.

15. Significant Notes

1. The prescribed credit weightage includes Lecture, Tutorial, and Practical components.
2. In the first semester, students will be offered three different subjects within the same stream: A, B, and C (Core and Minor are provided here for illustrative purposes only).
3. At the end of the second semester, each student may choose one of two programmes: the Multi- Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary or Single Core Discipline (Major) programme. The student choosing the latter will be required to give his/her Major and Minor at the end of the second semester. Such choices, including DSCs made at the end of the second semester, shall remain in effect until the VI semester.
4. Additional Seats: The Colleges may create 10% extra seats over and above the sanctioned strength to accommodate the request for a change of major. Any unfilled or vacant seats may be filled with those seeking a change of Major. Preference will be given to those with the highest CGPA and no arrears in the first year/semester.
5. The DSCs of another discipline for the first two semesters of students who opt for Major programmes will be treated as Minors.
6. A DSC offered in one discipline will be treated as a Minor by another. Students can choose Minor Courses from two different subjects, but must earn a minimum of 12 credits in each.
7. MDCs must be selected from a broad discipline/pool of MDCs other than Major and Minor subjects.
8. AEC/VAC/SEC-3 should be chosen from a pool of courses. Every discipline shall provide these courses, some of which will be offered discipline-specific, while the rest can be open to students of all other disciplines. However, the two SECs (SEC-1 & SEC-2) must be chosen from the discipline-specific (Core and Minor).
9. A maximum of two language courses can be opted for as Core and Minor. AECs should be in a language other than what is studied in DSCs/Minors.
10. I/A/P/C will be determined at the end of the first semester to enable students to carry out some I/A/P/C activities during winter vacation.
11. To pursue an Honour degree in the 4th year, students will have to choose only one discipline in both semesters, in which s/he has studied 6 DSCs and 5 DSEs in the first three years.
12. A student who secures 75% or more marks in aggregate till semester 6 (up to a 3-year degree) shall be eligible for a 4-year degree Honours with Research, provided HPU has approved the college to offer it.
13. One course per semester (DSC/Minor/MDC/SEC/etc) from a subject offered in two (or more) different programs (e.g. BCA and BSc/ BPA and BA/ BFA and BA/ Shastri and BA/etc) must be the same.
14. Students in the BA programmes can opt for only one DSC each from the Bachelor of Performing Arts (Dance, Music, Vocal & Instrument/ Tabla/ etc.) and the Bachelor of Fine Arts (Painting/Applied Arts/Sculpture/ etc.).

15. Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfilment of the following conditions: For Major, 64credits in a 3-year & 84 credits in a 4-year UG programme in a single Major Discipline. For Minor 28 credits in 4-year UG programme in a single Minor Discipline
16. The Dissertation and Project will start in the VII semester. However, the evaluation and assessment will be conducted in both the VII and VIII semesters.

**As this scheme is being introduced for the first time, it is subject to modifications. Any changes applied in subsequent years after admission to the 1st Year will be retrospectively applicable.*

22. Examinations

Every student after fulfilling the requisite conditions shall be allowed to fill in the examination form, which will be duly verified by the concerned college/institution.

23. Eligibility for appearing in Examinations

- i. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be eligible to appear in the End-Semester Examination (ESE). Deficiency in attendance may be relaxed as per Himachal Pradesh University Ordinance.
- ii. If a student does not take admission and fills online examination form, he/she shall not be permitted to appear in the ESE examination and the online examination form if filled by such a student will be rejected/ cancelled. The examination fee submitted will not be adjusted/ refunded in any case.
- iii. A student who does not pass the examination (ESE) in any course(s) or due to some reason is not able to appear in the ESE, other conditions being fulfilled i.e. CCE uploaded online, is considered as “Fail” and shall be permitted to re-appear in such failed course(s) in the following October or April, as per the Odd and Even semester examination schedule till the completion of time period for the degree.
- iv. No candidate shall be allowed to appear in the examination without admit card, however, in exceptional circumstances candidate may be considered to appear in one paper as per the University Ordinance.
- v. While appearing in the examination within the stipulated time, student with re-appear may be exempted from appearing in paper(s) and /or the practicals in which student has already obtained the required pass marks.
- vi. In order to change division and or secure first class/distinction /exemplary, the candidate shall be allowed to take the examination twice i.e. only two chances will be allowed for improvement in ESE. However, these examinations will be conducted after the completion of the degree and within the total duration of the programme. The new marks, however, shall be taken into account and a new CMC (with Improvement) will be issued only if the division changes or the student achieves First class/distinction/exemplary. Division will be calculated on the basis of CGPA.

24. Evaluation

Evaluation shall be based on **Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE), End-Semester Examination (ESE) and Practical/Dissertation/Viva-Voce etc.**, which will contribute to the final grade. ESE will consist of written examination at the end of the semester which will be conducted by the University.

24.(i) Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation

- i. CCE marks obtained by students will be uploaded through online mode only. Copy of the original award list of CCE, duly signed by the concerned teacher and verified by the Principal/Head/Director, will be submitted to the University before the result declaration.

- ii. Before entering online CCE marks, the marks list will be displayed on college Notice Board. Students' grievances, if any, may be resolved by the college authority.
- iii. For the Distance Education Courses (through CDOE of HPU), CCE will be entered on the basis of the assignments submitted by students.
- iv. In case a student fails to clear CCE due to house test / class test and /or Assignment / Presentation and/or practical etc, he/she shall be give additional two chaces priorb to commencement of ESE to qualify CCE.
- v. If a student fails to clear the Continous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) even after availing all permissible chances in a particular course, he/she shall be required to redo the CCE in the subsequent semester.
- vi. The relaxation in attendance and condonment of shortage of attendance if any shall be goverened by the existing norms of H.P. University.

25. Course-Wise Credits and Division of Marks

Credits- The term 'credit' refers to the weightage given to a course, usually in terms of the number of instructional hours per week assigned to it.

For credit determination, instruction is divided into three components:

Lectures(L)—Classroom lectures.

Tutorials (T)—Special, elaborate instructions on specific topics (from Lectures).

Practicals(P)—Laboratory of field exercises in which the student has to do experiments or other practical work.

$$\text{Credit (C)} = L + T + P$$

26. Pass Criteria

- i. In order to pass in a course, the following pass criteria must be fulfilled:
 - a. Pass percentage in ESE : 35%
 - b. Pass percentage in CCE : 35%
 - c. Pass percentage in Practical/Dissertation/Viva-Voce etc., if any: 35%
 - d. Pass percentage in Aggregate : 40%
 - e. Passing marks in in I/A/P/C?research/Desertatio: 35% minimum in each individual component and 40% in aggregate.
 - f. Passing marks in accredited online courses : In accordance with SWAYAM / MOOCS guidelines.
- ii. If a subject does not have a practical component: The student will have to pass both the components (i.e. CCE and ESE) separately and also in aggregate to become eligible to be declared successful in a subject.
- iii. If a subject has a Practical/Dissertation/Viva-Voce etc. component: Student will have to pass all the components (i.e. CCE and ESE and Practical/Dissertation/Viva-Voce etc.) separately and also in aggregate to become eligible to be declared successful in a subject.
- iv. The passing criteria for UG professional courses (BBA, BCA, BFA, BTTM) will be as per the passing criteria defined in the syllabus of that stream.

27. Degree Completion Duration

- i. Regular student of affiliated colleges can complete the UG degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years for Four-year Degree Programme and six dyears for three year degree programme. The gap between the semesters should not be more than three years as per academic session, subject to completion of the whole UG programme within seven years
- ii. Students of CDOE can complete the degree programme as per the DEB guidelines (The maximum duration for completion and award of degree at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels or post graduate diploma in Open and Distance Learning mode and Online mode shall be double the minimum duration of the respective programmes) or as applicable from time to time. For e.g. B.A. degree of three years period shall be completed within six years.

28. Multiple Entry and Exit in UG Academic Programme

The Rules and Regulation for Multiple Entry and Exit are as per the Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in Himachal Pradesh University. Multiple entry and exit options under three year degree programme with UG certificate/ UG diploma/or degree depending upon the number of credits secured is as follows:

28.(i) Re-entry in to UG Degree Programme

- i. A student can seek re-entry to the degree programme after exiting. However, the re-entry within a maximum gap period of three years after taking exit. Moreover, a student cannot stay out of a degree programme for more than three years in aggregate.
- ii. In addition, the Three-year and Four Year degree Programmes have to be completed in the maximum stipulated period of six and seven years respectively. In any case, the gap between the exit and the re-entry into the UG programme should not be more than three years subject to completion of the whole UG three/ four years programme within six/seven years respectively.
- iii. Re-entry may be within the University i.e. between Colleges of the University (shifting from one college to another depending upon the availability of seats), it may be called

as Transfer of Admission (Inter-college migration) by taking No Objection Certificate (consent) from both the colleges and final approval by the University by paying the requisite fee as per the rules of the University.

Note:

The above guidelines/ conditions may vary as per latest notification by the university.

College will offer a 3-Year or 4-Year undergraduate programme as per the latest notification of H.P. University/ H.P government.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

1. **Bachelor of Arts (BA Pass Course):** The students who have passed +2 examinations or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (including English) with 33% marks. However, the students opting Mathematics as one of the subjects of study must have 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at +2 level.
2. **Bachelor of Science (BSc Pass Course):** +2 examinations or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four subjects (three science subjects & one English) with 45% marks. The students seeking admission in BSc 1st Semester (non-Medical) have the option to choose either Chemistry or Computer Science as one of the Discipline Specific Courses for study.
3. **Bachelor of Commerce (BCom Pass Course):** The candidates with 40% marks in commerce stream or 45% marks in four written subjects, including English at +2 level, are eligible for admission to BCom pass course. The minimum eligibility condition for a girl student to get admission in BCom is 33% marks in +2 examination. However, for admission to BCom pass course the candidate must have passed Mathematics/Economics as compulsory subject at his/her +2 stage.

Note : i. All the admissions in BA/BSc/BCom 1st semester will be made on the basis of merit of the qualifying examination, that is, on the basis of percentage/marks of +2 examination.

ii. The student placed under compartment or failed in +2 examinations are not eligible for seeking admission.

AGE LIMIT AND RELAXATION

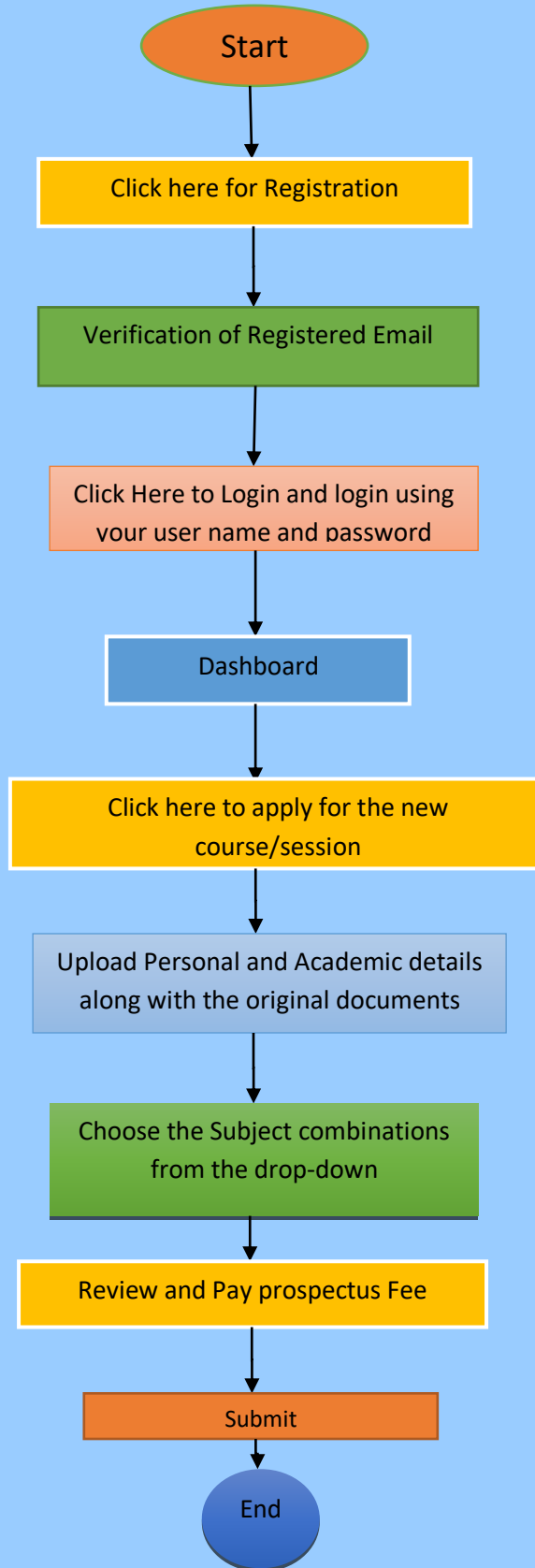
1. Admission is not granted to the student in 1st semester if he/she has attained the age of 23 in the case of boys and 25 in the case of girls on 1st July of the year concerned.
2. The upper age limit will be raised by three years for students belonging to SC/ST categories.
3. The Principal has discretion to provisionally grant age relaxation to the students of general category up to a maximum of six months subject to the final approval by the Vice-Chancellor of H.P. University.

2. Admission will not be granted after the expiry of admission dates.

Other Fee and Charges:

1. **Tuition fees @ Rs 50/ month for each year.**
2. **Exemption of tuition fees** will be available to girls with Himachal Pradesh's bonafide only on the production of the bonafide certificate.
3. Science Practical fees @ Rs 20/month/subject (Physics, Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, and Computer Applications/Science) for each year.
4. Practical fees for other subjects: Physical Education, Music and Geography @ Rs 15/month/ subject for each year.
5. Computer Fund of Rs.180/- will be charged from B.Com 1st& B.Com 2nd year

NOTE:-

1. The above fees and funds are subject to change as per HPU/ HP Govt. Instructions.
2. Fine, if any, from the student will be collected at the end of the semester/session.
3. Candidate has to apply for the refund of security within the period of six months after the completion of his/her course failing which the security will be forfeited.

FEE CONCESSION AND FINE REMISSION

- For promoting higher education among women, the government of Himachal Pradesh has granted **complete tuition fee concession** to all bonafide Himachali girl students.
- The students with disability above 40% will be eligible for **full fee concession** subject to the production of relevant certificate issued by the competent medical authority at the time of admission.
- Parents having two children studying in the college will be charged PTA fee for one child.
- Parents having three children studying in the college will be charged PTA fee for two children.
- Remission of any fine imposed on a student can be granted by the Principal to some extent on genuine grounds.

FINE RELATED TO ABSENCE IN THE CLASS:

- After continuous absence from a class for a period of 10 days in Annual System, the name of the student will be struck-off from the college rolls and the information for the same will be displayed on the notice board and college web site.
- Re-admission with Rs.100/- and Rs.200/- for the first and second time respectively will be allowed on very specific grounds. Re-admission for the third time will not be allowed.
- Various fine charged from students will be as mentioned below:
 - Per-period absence fine = Rs 1/-
 - Practical class per day absence fine = Rs 3/-
 - Library fine on each book per day = Rs 1/-
 - Duplicate digital library Card = Rs 200/-
 - Re-admission fine (First time) = Rs 100/-
 - Re-admission fine (Second time) = Rs 200/-
 - Late Admission fee per day = Rs. 10/-

HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

The College has the facility of three hostels for the girls and one for the boys of the college:

- i) Tribal Girls' Hostel for 120 Girls
- ii) Bhadri Girls' Hostel for 60 Girls.
- iii) Tribal Boys' Hostel for 70 Boys
- iv) Dr. Ambedkar Girls' Hostel for 48 Girls

Admission Process

- Admission to the hostels is granted strictly on merit and good conduct basis. In Tribal (Boys/Girls') Hostels, first preference will be given to the tribal boy/girl students and if seats fall vacant, SC/OBC, Backward Area and General Category boys/girls are also allowed. In Bhadri Girl's Hostel, the seats reserved for the SC/ST/OBC and Physically Handicapped girls are 15%, 7.5% and 5% respectively.
- The application forms along with the required documents/ certificates, for admission to any of the above hostels should reach the concerned hostel warden/clerk on or before the last date of admissions notified by the college.
- All the senior hostel residents are informed that they should apply for the hostel accommodation well in time failing which the vacant seats will be given to the students seeking admission in the college hostel.

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Leave Rules:

1. A student can proceed on leave with the prior permission from the college Principal. The application should also be prior signed by parent/ guardian of the student and duly recommended by the teacher.
2. A teacher can sanction leave up to maximum of 5 days and leave for longer duration will be sanctioned by the college Principal.
3. The student should make sure that the leave is noted by all the concerned teachers.
4. Leave on account of illness, if more than three days, must be accompanied by the medical certificate.
5. Students participating in various inter-college or inter-university or other competitions including NCC camps will have to get their leave sanctioned by the college Principal on the recommendation of their in charges before their departure.

Note: The general leave will only be counted for the relaxation in fine only and not be counted as the lecture attended. In case of participation in sports, cultural, NCC, NSS and other activities, the credit will be given to the students and will be counted as lecture attended.

OTHER RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. A student without an identity card, duly signed by the Principal, will be considered as an outsider.
2. Without identity card no student is allowed to enter the college.
3. It is mandatory for every student to maintain strict discipline within the college premises. Any act of a student that amounts to indiscipline will be dealt strictly. The following act comes within the ambit of indiscipline and misconduct: -
 - Ragging in and around the college campus
 - Eve-teasing
 - Scribbling/ Writing anything on the black-board, furniture, walls etc.
 - Damaging college property-- Breaking furniture/ window panes/ Tempering electrical and water fittings
 - Removing notices
 - Holding any meeting/ function/ party & taking photographs in the college premises without prior permission of the Principal
 - Using foul language with any student/ Principal/ teacher or any other employee of the college
 - Bringing outsiders to the campus
 - Smoking/ chewing tobacco/ taking drugs/ intoxicants/ alcohol anywhere in the college premises
 - Spitting
 - Any other act or acts which the Principal considers as major acts of misconduct and indiscipline

Strict action will be taken against defaulters.

4. All the students are directed to read the notices thoroughly which are displayed exclusively on the college notice board every day and do the needful accordingly.
5. Use of mobile phones in the class rooms or anywhere in the college campus is strictly prohibited in order to maintain academic environment. Any student found using mobile phones in the classroom/examination hall will be viewed seriously.
6. The name of a student shall be struck off from the college rolls, if there is an absence without sanctioned leave continuously for 10 days or more.
7. Regarding Readmission: If the name of a student is struck off, he/ she must be accompanied by his/ her parent or guardian at the time of admission. Re-admission will only be granted after the recommendation of the teacher concerned and the final approval by the Principal.

The student must seek re-admission within six days.

SOCIAL OUTREACH

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC):

NCC training instills a feeling of patriotism and discipline in the cadets for upholding the unity and integrity of our country and it prepares them for rendering services to our motherland in times of peace and natural calamities. The college unit offers two army wings with two caretaker officers (CTOs).The students may join NCC by filling in enrolment form available in the college office. The students enrolled under NCC are required to attend minimum 40 parades in a session as per the schedule. It is compulsory to attend theses parades in addition to 2 camps in order to appear for 'B' & 'C' certificate examinations. The cadets also learn mountaineering and rock climbing under different camps.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS):

The college has two units of NSS with hundred volunteers in each. The units follow the motto “Not Me But You” and actively organize cleanliness drives, plantation drives and awareness programs in the college as well as in the adopted villages. The volunteers also participate in a seven day special camp every year. A NSS certificate is given to a volunteer who devotes 120 hours of social work in one year for a certain or cumulative period, i.e., 240 hours in two years and attend the special camp of seven days.

ROVERS AND RANGERS:

The college runs a unit of Rovers (Boys) and Rangers (Girls) programme under one Ranger Leader and one Rover Leader. The college unit comprises of 24 Rovers and 24 Rangers. The students enrolled as Rovers and Rangers in the college are given training for the service of the Nation and humanity at large. Various activities with an aim to encourage the spirit of national integration and oneness are organized by the unit. The activities include adventure sports, community development, organizational work, skill development & awareness programmes organized by Bharat Scouts & Guides New Delhi. The Rangers and the Rovers earn various badges through their training camps. Aiming at the development of young students in achieving their physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potential as individuals; the college runs Rovers & Rangers. There are 24 seats respectively for Rovers & Rangers in the college, for which application forms are invited in the beginning of academic session, after scrutinizing the forms the selected students will be induced in R&R after completing codal formalities accordingly.

GOVERNANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Parent Teacher Association (PTA):

To encourage community participation in education, Parent Teacher Association (PTA) under sections 2.33 to 2.33.7 of the H.P. Education Code, 2001 has been established. Parent Teacher Association (PTA) has emerged as an effective solution to the problems of students and teachers in the field of education. It is a non-political body for better co-ordination and interaction between parents and teachers for improvement of academic standards and infrastructural facilities of the college, giving utmost priority to students' welfare. Parents or guardians who are in the blood relation of the students, teachers and head of the institution are the members of the association. Parents are advised to attend the General House and other meetings for which information is circulated through proper medium.

College Students' Central Association (CSCA):

The College Students' Central Association (CSCA) is a representative body of students to train them for their duties, responsibilities and rights of citizenship. The main function of CSCA is to ensure the maintenance of proper academic atmosphere and discipline among the students. All the colleges affiliated to H. P. University have their CSCA as per its guidelines. **The CSCA body consists of nominated posts of President, Vice-President, General Secretary, Joint Secretary and Class Representatives.** The nomination takes place on the basis of HPU Grade Cards. The Principal acts as the Chief Advisor with Five Teacher Advisors nominated by him/her. As many as 16 students without standing performance in academic, cultural and co-curricular activities are also nominated by the Head of Institution. The nomination of CSCA office bearers and class representatives is held on the date notified by H.P.University.

ACADEMIC OUTREACH

IGNOU Study Centre- 1110:

Indira Gandhi National Open University, New Delhi, opened a study centre in this college in 1996. This study centre provides opportunities to opt for job-oriented courses such as Rural Development, Human Rights, Tourism Studies, Food & Nutrition and Computer Education; Certificate Courses in Organic Farming and Sericulture; and Diploma in Value Added Products from Fruits Vegetables and Dairy Technology. The study centre also provides Bachelors Degree in Arts and Commerce. The students can enroll themselves with this study centre for different Job-Oriented Certificate and Diploma Courses simultaneously with B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. degree courses. ICDEOL Learning Support Centre:

International Centre for Distance and Open Learning H.P. University, Shimla has opened a learning Support Centre in this College in 2019. The objective of ICDEOL is to facilitate the students enrolled through Open Distance Learning Mode for UG and PG level courses in the college. EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Educational Tours and Excursion:

The college encourages and allows Educational Tours and Excursions during the session, under the guidelines laid down in letter No EDN-HEB(6)2/2009-Misc Directorate of Higher Education Feb. 2019 as follows:

1. The faculty/ staff accompanying the students will travel in the vehicle in which students are travelling.
2. Students will not be allowed to travel without accompany of teacher/ staff deputed with them.
3. If girl students are participating in the Educational Tour, one female staff must accompany the students.
4. Written consent of the parents is essential to allow the students for participating in the educational tour.
5. Tour programme should be signed and recommended by the Principal.
6. The students will not be allowed to perform any recreational activity during the tour.
7. The Educational Tour should be need based and part of course.
8. Tour programme must be intimated to the Deputy Commissioner of the respective District and local administration before departure.

College Magazine-- Kinner-Kailash:
