A meeting of the IBAC was held in the IBAC room to discuss a representation submitted by the faculty members regarding suggestions to improve the quality of the institution in the ensuing session 2019-20. The following was discussed and approved to be submitted to the Principal for necessary action.

1. The IBAC endorsed the recommendation of the faculty members that for quality education and even distribution amongst all the departments, the intake of students should be restricted as per UAC/NPU norms.

2. Strictness regarding CCA marking must be followed. Re-admission of the student whose name has been struck off should be granted only after the permission of the teacher concerned.

3. The Parent-Teacher meeting should be compulsorily held on SSC-I basis. The date for the same should be notified in the prospectus.

4. Principal's address must be made compulsory for everyone to attend. The IBAC recommends that the same may be held tentatively in the 2nd week of regular teaching in the session.

5. Career guidance cell must be active during admission process in order to help student in choosing right subject combinations according to their liking, strength and weakness.

6. Before inter-college events intra-college competitions should be organized to select the college team.

7. Hanging I-cards/Neck I-card must be made compulsory for easy identification of the students. The IBAC endorses that during the teaching hours the

College should have a single gate entry.

8. Gym facility should be provided and be fully functional and upgraded in the college campus.

9. Online admission should be facilitated preferably from the evening session. Similarly efforts must be made to start an online fee-gateway.

Subject: Suggestions regarding new academic session.

Respected Madam,

As the preparations for session 2019-20 is underway and work on the prospectus has also begun. The faculty members of Government College Rampur B.S. would like to give some suggestions for the smooth functioning of admission process and maintenance of discipline along with proper sharing of workload among faculties in our college. The suggestions are as follows:

1. Admissions to any subject should be made on UGC University norms, i.e. 120 students for DSC 1 and 80 students for DSC 2 or at most 120 students each for DSC 1 and DSC 2. total number of students should not exceed 240 students per subject under any circumstances. This will help in quality education and will distribute students evenly among all faculties. Admissions to Generic Elective (GE) subject should also be limited to 120 students per subject, for equal distribution of workload. This will help students to choose different subjects which will result in expanding their knowledge base, as we have seen from previous experiences that students only opt for well known and popular subjects. *Central committee will be formed to monitor equal distribution.*
2. Parents-teachers meeting should be made compulsory on DSC 1 basis. This will make parents aware about the activities and performance of their wards which will result in curbing indiscipline among students.
3. Principal's address must be made compulsory for everyone to attend. This should be on very first teaching day and can be named as orientation day.
4. Career guidance cell must be active during admission process in order to help students in choosing right subject combinations according to their liking, strength and weakness.
5. Intra-college competitions should be organized for Group 1 activities such as Debate, Declamation, Quiz, Painting, Photography and Clay modeling etc. same can done for Group 2, 3 and 4 activities in order to prepare students in better manner for inter college competitions.
6. The choices and likings of teachers may be taken into consideration while assigning duties of team incharge and duties of those committees which requires specific knowledge, so that better results can be achieved by taking benefit from the expertise of teachers.

The meeting started with a welcome note by the convener and asking the students to convey their concern and suggestions for quality enhancement of the institution. The following was ^{discussed} ~~been~~ resolved in the meeting in the form of suggestions by students.

- All the representatives endorsed the resolutions of the OSCA that the functions of the regional student associations should be banned in the college as it vitiates the academic atmosphere in the college.
- The student union agreed to hold two functions per academic session out of which one will be paid and other ^{will be} ~~is~~ free. UGC charges would be levied at the rate of 1500 (One thousand & five hundred). The payment of the second function suggested by the student of 10000 out of which five thousand is charges and five thousand refundable security subject to clearance by the Audit & Accounts Committee.
- The suggestion to restrict the number of students as per UGC rules and as per HP university guidelines to ensure qualitative education in the college.
- The students further suggested the following 'infrastructure' requirements:

1. Roof over for counter
- A4. A separate block for PG Classes
3. A Hostel for PG Students
4. All weather. Air conditioner in library
5. A Boxing ring. Should be set up urgently
6. Keeping in view the fact that this college is the Gold medal winner in HP university inter-college Championship both in men-women section
6. Separate library block or arrangement of books for PG students.
7. Girls common room
8. As far as the washrooms are concerned it was suggested that the condition of all the washrooms may kindly be inspected & repaired to make them functional & should be fully equipped with dustbins, mirrors, exhaust fan, door closers, air fresheners, Physio balls etc.
9. In the blocks under construction, the male and female washrooms should be on separate floors or in separate directions.
10. C.C.TV Camera (digital) should be installed in B.Voc and BCA and IT Lab.
11. Upgradation of internet facility on the campus.
12. Hanging E cards should be made for maintaining discipline in the campus
13. Intra college competitions may be held for selection of the college team for

- HP university inter-college competitions.
14. The department for PG may facilitate internship as well as may facilitate an practical teaching.
15. Bus pass counter should be set up on first two working day of the month and two mid days of the month so as to facilitate bus pass making.
16. ATM may kindly be set up for the benefit of students and staff community.
17. The entry points to the institution should be restricted to the main gate of the college only.
18. The entrance from the ground should be blocked during teaching hours.
19. G.E. Slow light / traffic light should be installed & zebra crossing marking should be done near the college gate on the NH.

Report of "Feedback form on curriculum for Teachers" for session: 2019-2020

Arts:

1. Political Science: Syllabus for B.A II year and III year SEC should be improved.
2. Education: Some of the topics added are not according to the grade and standard of the students and also there are no such books prescribed for the syllabus. Secondly medium is also an issue.
3. Economics: Current topics of economic World must be included in the syllabus.
4. Hindi : Some topics related to environment should be included.
5. English: Changes in the syllabus is needed in view of competition as the world is becoming a global village.
6. Sociology: Improvement and addition in the syllabus, addition of moral values which are important in the present era. There is decline of social values and hence give emphasis to bring harmony and coherence in the society.

Commerce:

In cost accounting care studies of companies regarding costing shall be included in the course. Add some practical work with theory.

Sciences

1. Maths: Computer based contents should be included. Syllabus should be job oriented. Books of some foreign authors should be introduced.
2. Chemistry: Syllabus of B.Sc II Year should be reduced and more practicals should be according to the theory and SEC should be practical oriented.
3. Botany: Syllabus of B.Sc I Year should be reduced. In the syllabus more unknown plants used by remote/ tribal people must be included and everyone should be benefitted for such plants. The recommended book for the course is "An Introduction of Ethnobotany" by Jain, S.K and Jain A.K (ed.) 2013 by Deep Publication New Delhi.

Computer Science: HTML practical for PHP should be included.

B.C.A :

More theory subjects should be added and mathematical subjects should be minimised. More practicals and languages should be added. Syllabus should be updated as per current time. Maths should be eliminated from 2nd and 3rd year.

B. Voc. :

In H&T course other major department subjects should be introduced such as F&B service, Housekeeping, F&B production. There should also be proper books for general component subjects.

Detailed Report of feedback forms from the students, teachers, and alumni on curriculum for the session 2020-21.

The feedback suggests that:

- Interdisciplinary:** The syllabus across all the streams requires interdisciplinary. The upgraded syllabus needs to incorporate contemporary topics from every field that matches the global standard of world class universities.
- Skill based learning:** The present syllabus requires modification according to the skill based learning of present times. Along with theory practical knowledge, encouraging internship and industry interaction should be promoted across the streams of Commerce, BCA and B.Voc.
- Inculcating Moral Values:** The courses need to incorporate studies related to moral and ethical values. The curriculum although well-designed should encourage the understanding of past and present culture and heritage.
- Development of soft skills:** In this fast changing world, language becomes an expression of one's personality and mind. Therefore, the curriculum needs to cater to the local as well as global standards. Along with the changing dynamics of India in the era of globalisation, the need of the hour is to encourage and empower our curriculum with ICT and modern teaching learning methods on communication skills (Hindi & English). A compulsory seminar activity should be a part of the curriculum prescribed by the affiliated university.
- Environmental Awareness:** The practical implication or applicability of environmental awareness is utmost important and relevant at the global and

local land. This goal although can be comprehended through theory but collaboration at the local level should also be promoted through writing of research paper, field visits, seminars inviting eminent scientists and environmental social workers. 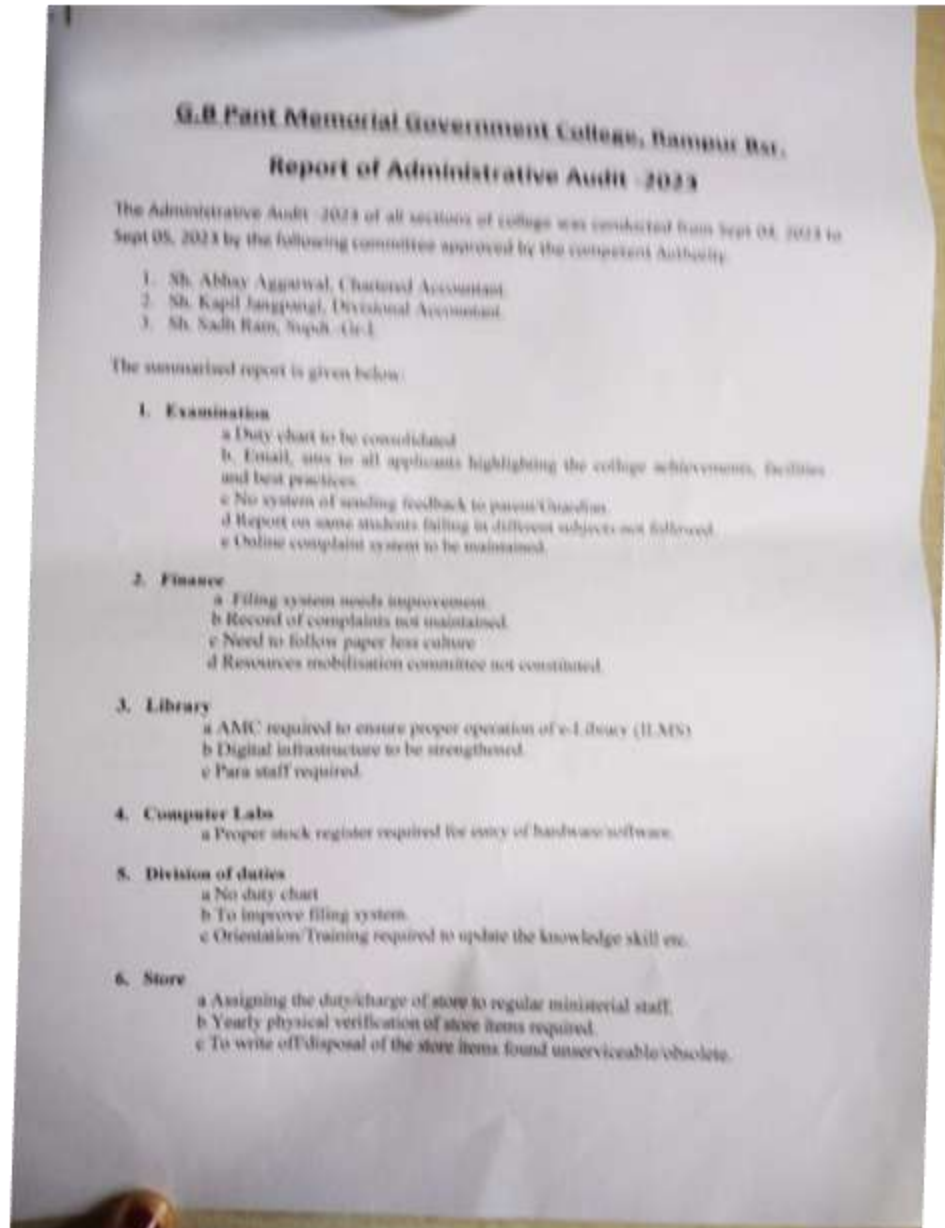

21. Faculty conducts seminars for the UG and PG students.


22. Institute offers ample opportunities for co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.




1. Student-teacher ratio needs to be improved.

12. Post of technical/ministerial staff should be increased.


